


Three Pro-Junior tandems in The First Tee Open finished at 18-under-par: Billy Andrade and Ross Funderburke (The First Tee of Roanoke Valley), Michael Allen and Patrick Fernandez (The First Tee of Phoenix), and Kevin Sutherland and Jonathan Tanihana (The First Tee of Sacramento). Fernandez prevailed in a scorecard playoff, the second scorecard playoff in The First Tee Open tournament history.

The First Tee has been an important part of our lives for over five years, and we have watched how participation in the program has changed Ross from an impatient and temperamental golfer into a patient young man filled with respect for his opponents, the game, and the courses he plays. In addition to the internal value of the program, the external opportunities that are offered to participants are both rewards for hard work and chances to extend the learning outside of the Roanoke Valley. Ross has dreamed of the chance to play in The Nature Valley First Tee Open, a Champions Tour event contested at Pebble Beach and Poppy Hills. Over the

years, we've heard many stories from past participants, but nothing could have prepared us for our experience. Weeks after our return from The Nature Valley First Tee Open, we are still pinching ourselves in disbelief! From the moment we arrived in California, we were whisked away on a magical ride in the beauty of the Monterrey Peninsula, where we met people from every part of the county, each with a personal story and dream, but all united in their love of golf and The First Tee.

At this event, each of the 81 First Tee participants was paired with a professional golfer for their days of competition. During the first two days, they also

What a Year!

We've had a very successful year at The First Tee of Roanoke Valley! This year, our coaches and volunteers delivered The First Tee lessons in golf skills and life skills to over 800 young people around the area at locations including at our Densmore Road facility, the 4H Camps at Smith Mountain Lake, Rockbridge County, YMCA Magic Place summer camps, and Boys and Girls Club. In addition, programs have been delivered at 24 area schools, reaching approximately 6500 students. Through all of our programs, The First Tee of Roanoke Valley has impacted 7300 children this year; classes are steadily growing 9% over the previous year. There is a place for every young person at The First Tee of Roanoke Valley — participants are from every back ground and skill level imaginable.

The First Tee of Roanoke Valley PGA Junior League team finished second in the regular season as well as second overall in the local PGA Junior Golf League. Our team enjoyed the competition and camaraderie that the league provides, as well as the opportunity to play and learn in a team-oriented environment. The team also had two players selected to the Roanoke Valley All-Star Team that made it to the second round of Regional play.

Our high school participants have really shined in 2016. Alisa Caraballo, 15 years old, became our youngest Ace Certified participant by completing the final level of The First Tee curriculum. Sabrina Landsman and Madison Horacek attended The Robins Junior Golf Camp this summer, courtesy of the VSGA Fleming Fund. **Grace Huffman** attended three national academies, including IJGA in Hilton Head where she and Logan Akers received world class instruction alongside some of the best US junior players. In September, Callie Montgomery and Ross Funderburke competed in The First Tee Open in Pebble Beach, which was the experience of a lifetime for both.

to apply what they have learned is another. A good coach understands how to build a student's confidence to become more independent. Students have to understand how to improve on their own. A good coach provides insight and acknowledges a student's strengths and weaknesses.

Through my training in The First Tee coaches program, I've learned the skills required of a good coach. I know it's important what you teach as well as how you teach it. To keep kids engaged, lessons have to be fun and safe. Our students learn life skills like communication, self-management, and how to resolve conflicts. As a coach, it's important to nurture the skills as our young students develop them. Young people need to learn how to problem solve and make good decisions. Young people need opportunities which can help them build good character. And above all, they need to be valued.

I consider being a First Tee Coach a privilege, because of my love for the game and the desire to grow it, as well as for everything that being a coach represents. Besides "Daddy," it's the best name I've ever been called.

Which Class is Right For Your Child?

Not sure which class to choose? Following is a sis a guideline to help you with registration. As always, please feel free to email or phone Coach Bill if you have any questions.

If your child is ages 5-7, then Tiger Paws is the right introductory class. Seven-year olds can start in PLAYer. We generally follow the national First Tee age standards where 7 is the minimum age for PLAYer; age 9 for PAR; age 11 for BIRDIE; age

13 for EAGLE; and age 14 for ACE. Each level has skill/playing requirements as well as written assessments related to Life Skills & Golf Knowledge. The PAR class requires one 9-hole round of golf with a score of 72 or under; BIRDIE requires five 9-hole rounds with a score of 63 or lower; and EAGLE requires ten 18-hole rounds with scores under 106.



USA! USA! USA! After an eight year drought, the United States Team won the 2016 Ryder Cup! Two of the integral players on this year's team were **Rickie Fowler** and **Patrick Reed**, both of whom walked the fairways of Roanoke Country Club during the 2006 Scott Robertson Memorial. Thanks for helping to bring the Ryder Cup back to the US!

In addition to Ryder Cup accolades, Patrick Reed finished 3rd in the FedEx Cup points for 2016. The 2016 FedEx Cup top 50 money-makers list is peppered with former Scott Robertson Memorial participants and champions. **Emiliano Grillo** (2009) finished in 11th place, **Roberto Castro** (2001) 22nd, **Kevin Kisner** (2001) 23rd, **William McGirt** (1997) 24th, **Daniel Berger** (2001) 26th, **Sean O'Hair** (1999) 27th, **Kevin Na** (1999, 2000, 2001) 28th, **Rickie Fowler** (2006) 31st, **Smylie Kauffman** (2006, 2007, 2008) 43rd, and **Harris English** (2003, 2004) 47th.

Our 2009 Scott Robertson Memorial Champion **Stewart Hagestad** won the 2016 USGA's Mid-Am. In addition to having his name forever engraved on the trophy, Hagestad secured his spot in the 2017 Masters tournament.

Ladies of the Scott Robertson Memorial have a strong showing atop the LPGA's money list. Three-time SRM participant **Ariya Jutanugarn** (2010 2011, 2012) is currently in second place on the official LPGA money list. Also in the top 50 are **Brooke Henderson** (2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014) 3rd, **Lexi Thompson** (2007) 14th, **Jenny Shin** (2006, 2007) 22nd, **Candie Kung** (1999) 29th, **Jessica Korda** (2009, 2010) 33rd, **Moriya Jutanugarn** (2010, 2011, 2012) 40th, **Morgan Pressel** (2001) 43rd, and **Brittany Lincicome** (2002, 2003) 48th.

This year, history was made in the LPGA with the youngest member ever to be named to the LPGA Hall of Fame. **Inbee Park** (2003, 2004) fulfilled her lifetime dream to play on the LPGA tour in 2007, and in 10 years qualified for the Hall of Fame. Congratulations Inbee for this fantastic accomplishment!
